Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for this award, students must be a member of the Nova Scotia Jr. Association of Chefs and Cooks (NSACC) or one of the two Canadian Association of Foodservice Professionals (CAFP) Nova Scotia Student Branches at Mount Saint Vincent University or St. Francis Xavier University. Previous winners are not eligible.

Selection Criteria

Student members who demonstrate Bob's dedication and interest in the foodservice industry and those who best represent the qualities that Bob brought to CAFP will be considered for the award.

Award Frequency

Two Scholarships of \$2,250 will be awarded in 2011.
